- Know the following bold vocabulary terms (fill-in-the-blank)
 - The French & Indian War was fought between **Great Britain** and **France**
 - Most of the **Native Americans** were allies (fought with) the French
 - **Colony** - an area controlled by or belonging to a country far away from it. (ex. the 13 colonies were ruled by Great Britain)
 - **Colonist** - a person who lives in a colony
 - **Tension** - is a state in which people, groups, or countries disagree and feel anger toward each other.
 - **Proclamation** - an official public announcement or statement made by a person in power or government.
- Using the maps below, be able to:
 - Explain who had the **best geographic claim** in North America in **1763** AND why.
 - Explain who **lost** the most land between 1750 and 1763 AND why.

1763 Map

- The British, French, and Native Americans all wanted something leading up to the French and Indian War. Know what each one **wanted** and what **strategy** they used to try to get it.
 - **Native Americans**
 - **Want:** to keep their land, lifestyle, and control of their future
 - **Strategy:** trade with the Europeans, but prevent settlement
 - **French**
 - **Want:** to control the Native American fur trade on all the land they claimed
 - **Strategy:** keep control over the Ohio River Valley
 - **British**
 - **Want:** settle in the land west of the Allegheny Mountains (a part of the Appalachian mountains) for farming and land control (wealth & opportunity)
 - **Strategy:** gain control over the Ohio River Valley
- Explain **why the French and Indian War was fought**.
 - Great Britain and France both claimed the Ohio River Valley and could not agree about which country should control it, so a war began. The British ultimately won the land in the Ohio River Valley.
- Explain how the **Proclamation of 1763** helped the **Native Americans**.
 - The Proclamation of 1763 helped the Native Americans because it stated that they could have much of the land west of the Appalachian Mountains as they wanted and that settlers could not move to these areas.
- Explain **how the colonists felt** about the **Proclamation of 1763** AND **why** they felt that way.
 - The colonists disliked this law because they did not like the way in which Great Britain was trying to control the colonies (ex. telling them they could not move west). Many colonists simply ignored the law and moved west anyway.
