can be found easily in the text and have one, clear right answer.

- Who...?
- What...?
- Where...?
- When...?
- How many...?

Thin questions can usually be answered with just a few words

### THICK questions...

take more work to answer! Readers must think <u>deeply</u> about the question and search for clues in the text to support their answer

- I WONDER WHY...?
- WHAT WOULD HAPPEN IF...?
- I WONDER HOW THE CHARACTER FELT WHEN...?
- I WONDER WHY THE AUTHOR SAID...?

Remember: THICK=THINK! It takes at least a few sentences to explain your thinking and answer a thick question completely
