There will be **five parts** to the test, in which you will have to:

- **Part #1** Read a passage about a hike titled, "A Fall Hike at Cutler Pond." Then, complete <u>6 multiple choice questions</u> about the text.
- Part #2 Read a passage about the nonfiction author, Jon Krakauer, titled, "Jon Krakauer," and a poem titled, "A Perfect Day." Then, complete <u>8 multiple choice</u> <u>questions</u> about both texts.
- Part #3 Respond to a prompt related to <u>BOTH</u> "A Fall Hike at Cutler Pond" and "A Perfect Day" by writing a <u>short response</u> (2-3 sentences).
- Part #4 Read a passage from a report written by a student, which contains some mistakes in grammar and punctuation. Then, complete <u>5 multiple choice questions</u> about revising and editing the passage.
- **Part #5** Respond to a prompt based on the passage "Jon Krakauer" by writing a report using information from the text.

## Key concepts/skills to know are:

- Determining the main/central idea of a text (passage and paragraph)
- Making **connections** between a <u>written story</u> and a <u>visual version</u> (movie)
- Referring to <u>details and examples in a text</u> when explaining what the text says and when drawing **inferences** from the text
- Recognizing and explaining the meaning of figurative language (idioms and personification)
- Recognizing the **structural elements of poems** (ex. stanza, verse, rhyme)
- Explain the meaning of simple **similes** and **metaphors** (e.g., *as pretty as a picture*) in context.
- Compare and contrast the **point of view** from which <u>different stories are narrated</u>, including the difference between first- and third-person narrations.
